

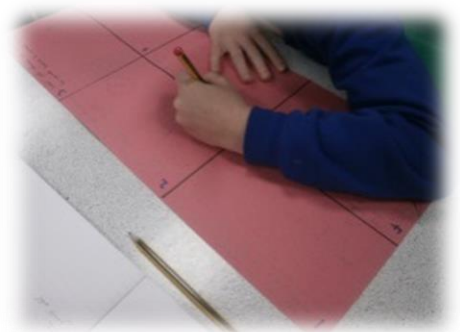
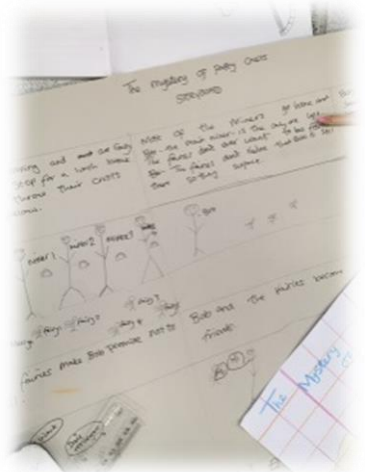


Spring Ex Days - Creating Cornish Stories

During this Ex Day children explored Cornish stories.

This topic allowed all children to explore creative writing and develop their teamwork skills to create their own Cornish storybooks.

Every Year Group looked at traditional Cornish stories: Soggy the Bear, Mousehole Cat and The Sandhorse. From this, the children worked in teams to create their own Cornish story and illustrate it using water colours.



National Curriculum Links:

Key Stage 1:

English

- Become familiar with and retell stories- Cornish stories such as Soggy the Bear, Mousehole Cat
- Read a range of fiction

- Elements of curriculum to be met through planning, writing, editing and presenting a story with unique, Cornish themed characters.

Art & Design

- Improve mastery of techniques such as drawing and painting- use watercolour to create book illustrations
- Use sketchbooks to record, evaluate, review, revisit and collect ideas- collect ideas for characters
